Rules: This game is best played with two teams of two people each. One team is 'X' and the other team is 'O'. Each team takes turns drawing a card from the deck and reading the clue to the other team who must decide whether the clue represents Nominal, Ordinal, Interval, or Ratio data. If the team is correct, they get to mark a spot corresponding to the correct answer on the game board below. If the team is incorrect, the team that read the clue gets to mark a spot corresponding to the correct answer on the game board below. The first team to get five in a row wins.
